## SCHOOL STRUCTURE AND TIMETABLE

- Burnaby South Secondary and BCSD are now operating on a Linear System.
- All students take 8 classes for the full school year
- Four classes are on Day 1 and 4 classes are on Day 2
- Each class is approximately 75 minutes in length
- 15 min break after 1st block
- 45 minutes lunch after 2 nd block


## COURSE SELECTION

- This course Selection Sheet is like a contract between you and BCSD.
- All schools are staffed and timetabled based on how you complete your course selection.
- Sometimes it is NOT possible for us to give you your $1^{\text {st }}$ choices (usually in electives)


FYI: Students in BCSD will have the majority of their courses within the BSCD environment and taught in ASL with some electives courses being integrated in Burnaby South with ASL Interpreters

## COURSE SELECTION

- Course Planning is the single most important process that occurs in high school. It determines the courses a student will take, as well as the courses that teachers will teach
- What to Expect in Grade 10?
- Workload
- Developing good work habits NOW is key
- Organization and Time Management
- Grade 10 is the beginning of the Graduation Program. All courses successfully completed give you graduation credits


## COURSE SELECTION

- Grade 10 students will take 8 courses:
- ASL 10
- English 10
- Math 10 (Foundations or Workplace Math)
- Social Studies 10
- Physical and Health Education 10
- Career Life Education 10


## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Students will need a minimum of 80 credits ( 20 courses) in grade 10 to 12 .
- 12 required courses
- English 10, 11 and 12
- Social Studies 10 and 11 or 12
- Science 10 and 11
- Math 10 and 11
- Physical and Health Education 10
- Career Life Education10 and Career Life Connections 12
- At least one course in Fine Arts/Applied Skills 10, 11 or 12
- One Course taken in grade 10-12 must have an Indigenous Focus i.e English First Peoples 12


## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 7 Elective Courses
- Mandatory to Graduate
- Literacy Assessment 10
- Numeracy Assessment 10
- Literacy Assessment 12


## TIPS FOR GRADE 10 COURSE SELECTION

- Talk to teacher
- Ask your teacher about what future courses are all about
- English and Math 10
- Talk to teacher to find out more information about what these grade 10 classes are:
- Math Foundation and Pre-Calculus 10 vs. Math Workplace 10
- English 10 Focuses vs. Creative Writing vs. First Peoples
- The teacher are your experts on the courses, because they are the ones teaching them.


## TIPS FOR GRADE 10 COURSE SELECTION

- You cannot choose the same course twice
- When you choose a course as your $1^{\text {st }}$ choices, you cannot choose that same course as one of your alternate courses.
