SCHOOL STRUCTURE AND TIMETABLE

- Burnaby South Secondary and BCSD are now operating on a Linear System.
- All students take 8 classes for the full school year
- Some students may have a class that is schedule before school or after school if they choose that option. In that case, they may have a free block during the regular school day.
- Four classes are on Day 1 and 4 classes are on Day 2
 - Each class is approximately 75 minutes in length
 - 15 min break after 1st block
 - 45 minutes lunch after 2nd block

REQUIRED GRADE 12 CLASSES

- Grade 12's are required to take the following:
 - 4 Grade 12 Level Courses
 - English 12
 - 3 Additional Grade 12 Level courses
 - Career Life Connections + Capstone
 - Work Experience (30 hours or 80 hours)
 - 4 "Elective" Courses that are chosen from the options on the course selection form

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Students will need a minimum of 80 credits (20 courses) in grade 10 to 12.
 - 12 required courses
 - English 10, 11 and 12
 - Social Studies 10 and 11 or 12
 - Science 10 and 11
 - Math 10 and 11
 - Physical and Health Education 10
 - Career Life 10
 - Fine Arts/Applied Skills 10, 11 or 12
 - One of these courses must have an Indigenous Focus i.e. English First Peoples 12

- Mandatory to Graduate
 - Literacy Assessment 10

TIPS FOR GRADE 12 COURSE SELECTION

- Talk to teacher
 - Ask your teacher about what grade 12 courses are all about
 - English, Math, Science and Social Studies
 - Talk to teacher to learn more about what these grade 12 classes are:
 - Math Streams
 - English Focuses
 - Science Streams
 - Social Studies Focuses

WORK EXPERIENCE

- 30 Hours Work Experience is a requirement for graduation
 - This is so you can gain employability skills and experience
- Students can choose 3 options for Work Experience
 - 30 Hours of Work Experience
 - Mandatory for Graduation
 - 80 Hours of Work Experience
 - 80 hours of volunteer work experience related to your career goals
 - 4 credits toward graduation
 - Complete a written assignment
 - Youth Train-in-Trades Programs
 - Combination of Course Work and Hands On Work Experience

WORK EXPERIENCE – 80 HOURS

- Earn 4 grade 12 elective credits
- 80 hours of career-related work experience
- Allows for career exploration in 1 or 2 focus areas of interest
- Helps to develop confidence in the workplace, references and experience for resumes and possible job contacts
- Must complete an Employability Skills Profile

- You will complete your Career Life Connections requirements for work experience
- Add it to your resume
- Assisting in University Applications
- Possibly use it towards applying for scholarships
- Gain Valuable work experience

CAREER LIFE CONNECTIONS - REQUIREMENTS

- Career Life Connections 11 & 12 is a MANDATORY REQUIREMENT for Graduation
- Grade 12's will be required to complete a CAREER FOCUSED GRADUATION PROJECT
- You will be applying your career-life exploration hours (30 Hours) towards this project
- An ONLINE ASSIGNMENTS will be required to demonstrate how you used the career-life exploration hours towards the CLC we Grad Project
- A PRESENTATION explaining your project will also need to be submitted in order to graduate

POST-SECONDARY TIMELINE TIPS

- Stage 1 Early Years
 - Early Financial Planning
 - look at saving for post-secondary, start up a tax-free saving account for the educational costs
- Stage 2 Grade 8-10
 - Academic Awareness
 - specific course you may want to take in grade 12
 - be aware of grades

POST-SECONDARY TIMELINE TIPS

- Stage 3 Grade 11-12
 - Getting Ready
 - Start researching scholarships, awards & financial aid options
 - Career Life Connections 12 Course
 - Set goals for making decisions
 - Start investigating specific post-secondary options
